

## **Data from flyers (classified by numbers and years) of the Post**

### **— flyer No. 4/1966 —**

Issuance of a 75c heraldic lion postage stamp printed using the typographic process

The postage stamps of 0.25fr, 0.60fr, and 0.75fr of the heraldic lion type were likewise pre-cancelled

Following the new postal rates effective from March 1, 1966, the 0.25fr and 0.60fr postage stamps of the heraldic lion type were reprinted.

### **— flyer No. 1/1968 —**

Issuance of a 2fr heraldic lion postage stamp printed using the typographic process made available for sale according to their production

### **— flyer No. 24/1969 —**

Issuance of a 1.50fr heraldic lion postage stamp printed using the typographic process made available for sale according to their production

### **— flyer No. 3/1973 —**

Issuance of a 4fr heraldic lion postage stamp printed using the typographic process made available for sale according to their production in the second half of 1973

### **— flyer No. 9/1974 —**

Abolition of postage values

The following postage values will no longer be sold after August 31, 1974: heraldic lion 0.02fr, 0.03fr, and 0.75fr

### **— flyer No. 13/1974 —**

The 0.05fr stamp (violet-blue), heraldic lion type, small format, which was withdrawn from circulation on November 30, 1961, will be reprinted in red and made available for sale starting September 30, 1974

### **— flyer No. 3/1975 —**

Issuance of a 5fr heraldic lion postage stamp new type printed using the typographic process on non-phosphorescent paper made available for sale starting March 17, 1975

### **— flyer No. 9/1975 —**

Pre-cancelled postage stamps of 0.60fr, 4.50fr, and 5fr of the heraldic lion type will be made available for sale starting May 12, 1975

### **— flyer No. 1/1975 —**

Issuance of a 4.50fr heraldic lion postage stamp printed using the typographic process on non-phosphorescent paper made available for sale starting December 16, 1974

### **— flyer No. 1/1977 —**

Issuance of a 4.50fr heraldic lion postage stamp new type printed using the typographic process on non-phosphorescent paper made available for sale starting February 14, 1977

### **— flyer No. 6/1977 —**

Issuance of a 1fr heraldic lion postage stamp new type printed using the typographic process on non-phosphorescent paper made available for sale starting April 12, 1977

### **— flyer No. 7/1978 —**

Pre-cancelled stamps of 1.50fr, 2fr, and 3fr heraldic lion new type printed on non-phosphorescent paper available for sale starting August 28, 1978

### **— flyer No. 9/1978 —**

Pre-cancelled stamps of 1.50fr, 2fr, and 3fr heraldic lion new type were made available for sale starting September 18, 1978

### **— flyer No. Diest /1980 —**

The pre-cancelled stamp heraldic lion old type of 2.50fr has been printed since October 9, 1980, on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper

The pre-cancelled stamp heraldic lion new type of 3fr was printed since October 20, 1980, on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper

### **— flyer No. 2/1980 —**

Pre-cancelled postage stamps of 2.75fr and 5fr of the new type heraldic lion were made available for sale starting January 28, 1980

The ordinary postage stamp heraldic lion new type of 1fr was printed starting January 4, 1980, on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper

### **— flyer No. 5/1980 —**

Pre-cancelled postage stamps of 0.05fr of the old type heraldic lion printed on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper were made available for sale starting March 3

#### **— flyer No. 7/1980 —**

The pre-cancelled stamp of 0.65fr heraldic lion new type printed on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper has been made available for sale starting April 14, 1980

The following heraldic lion stamps were printed on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper:

0.05fr old type since February 1, 1980, 2fr new type since February 6, 1980

#### **— flyer No. 12/1980 —**

The pre-cancelled postage stamp heraldic lion new type 2fr has been printed since July 15, 1980, on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper

#### **— flyer No. 1/1981 —**

Issuance of an ordinary postage stamp of 6fr heraldic lion new type, printed on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper available for sale starting January 26, 1981

The pre-cancelled postage stamp heraldic lion new type 1fr was printed starting December 17, 1980, on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper

#### **— flyer No. 7/1981 —**

The heraldic lion stamps valued at 0.65fr, 2.75fr, and 4.50fr, as well as the pre-cancelled stamps of the same value, will no longer be sold after November 30, 1981

#### **— flyer No. 7/1982 —**

Issuance of 7fr heraldic lion new type typographic process on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper starting May 17, 1982

4fr heraldic lion new type printed on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper available for sale starting May 17, 1982

#### **— flyer No. 9bis/1982 —**

Pre-cancelled postage stamps valued at 2.50fr of the new type heraldic lion printed on non-phosphorescent paper using the typographic process will be made available for sale starting September 6, 1982

Since June 24, 1982, the ordinary stamp heraldic lion new type has been printed on a new type of paper with the following characteristics:

Type: white paper, wood-free, non-phosphorescent for printing in typography

Gumming: dry gum based on starch, giving a bluish tint

The following heraldic lion new type stamp was also printed on the same paper: 4fr pre-cancelled July 12, 1982

Heraldic lion new type stamps printed on typographic paper with dry gum 3fr (September 13, 1982) and 7fr (September 22, 1982)

The pre-cancelled postage stamp heraldic lion new type of 1.50fr was printed since May 4, 1982, on polyvalent non-phosphorescent paper

#### **— flyer No. 1/1983 —**

1.50fr heraldic lion new type printed on typographic paper with dry gum since November 5, 1982

#### **— flyer No. 9 /1983 —**

2fr heraldic lion new type printed on typographic paper with dry gum starting March 31, 1983

Issuance of heraldic lion new type of 8fr starting May 9, 1983

1.50fr heraldic lion new type printed on typographic paper with dry gum starting April 7, 1983

Heraldic lion new type 2fr printed on typographic paper with dry gum starting January 16, 1984
